"Traditional clothes in Nusa Tenggara Timur is called Baju adat suku sumba. Nusa Tenggara Timur is the southernmost province of Indonesia.

For men, they wear the hinggi kombu cloth wrapped around the waist, tiara patang, and accessories in the form of bracelets. For women, they wear a kemben called ye'e, a sarong-shaped cloth, earrings, and a crescent-shaped headdress".



About

“My daughter came home from a frustrating shift at work. She vented for about 10 minutes, and I let her get everything out before I said anything. Noticing she seemed calmer, I asked, “Do you feel better after telling that story?” She took a deep breath, leaned against the refrigerator, and “Actually, I do. Thanks for listening.” Her pose, leaning against the fridge was the genesis of Brace.

The color choices reflect her change in mood once she dealt with what upset her. There was a visible change. I showed her Brace when it was done, and she said the woman looked like she was “touching grass”. Detaching, breathing, resetting our mind are essential to reduce life’s stress and focus on what is good, what we may take for granted. We brace, we breathe, we continue.”

Oivato Agosto | Outside

Oivato is an illustrator and comic book artist hailing from Brazil. This particular piece we felt was great. It's surreal, thought provoking and has a very pleasing colour palette. We really liked the concept of the Octopus arm snatching the aeroplane out of the sky. The mix of photography and 3D modelling really brings the image to life and we felt it deserved to be in the spotlight.



About

“At first, I didn’t capture the photo with the intention of including anything specific in the scene. I simply merged one of my photographs with a suitable 3D model. However, “Outside” marked the first time I intentionally took a photo while knowing what I would add to it.

Initially, my concept revolved around featuring a tentacle emerging from the window, possibly holding an object. Then, the idea of incorporating an airplane came to mind. My inspiration derives from the notion of introducing horror elements into ordinary spaces, creating a world where monsters are seamlessly integrated into daily life. It’s about evoking a sense of fear by placing these creatures in easily accessible locations or portraying the remnants of something terrifying that had once passed through”.



Chrispy | Raining Flowers

We thought this was a really thought provoking photograph from SE-Asia-based photographer 'Chrispy'. The composition and colour is really pleasant and invokes different thoughts about what the image could mean. The use of double exposure here is particularly creative, fusing the individual with an umbrella walking through a sky of flowers.



About

"I've always loved double exposures because you can take two completely unrelated images, fuse them together, and the results can often be quite magical. This technique creates a brand new and often surreal perspective. In that, I really enjoy taking a completely normal looking photograph, and turning it into something weird, or other-worldly.

For this particular image, I loved the focus on the woman walking with an umbrella in the bright sunshine, which I then fused with a floral pattern, making it seem like it was 'Raining Flowers', creating a nice juxtaposition between the two images. I really liked the end result of this one, and feel I captured the surreal elements I was hoping for".

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
